PART 1 - Reading

Read the text below about Recycling and what are Kanazawa City's actions on this topic.



There are three important words for the environment. All of them have the initial R, that is why collectively they are called '3R'. They are: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

According to the Ministry of the Environment of Japan, **reducing** means choosing to use things with care to reduce the amount of waste generated. **Reusing** involves the repeated use of items or parts of items which still have usable aspects. **Recycling**

means the use of waste itself as resources.

Waste minimization can be achieved in an efficient way by focusing primarily on the first of the 3Rs, "reduce," followed by "reuse" and then "recycle."

In Kanazawa (Ishikawa Prefecture), there is a place spreading this idea. This place is called Tomuro Recycling



Plaza. At this place, they display garbage, recycling and renewable energy, they also hold events where people can learn about the environment in a very fun way.



The garbage is displayed in an interesting way. Cardboards, for example, are used to build sculptures. They also hold auctions for used furniture and other objects that are in good condition. Any Kanazawa citizen can participate in the auction and acquire the items.
