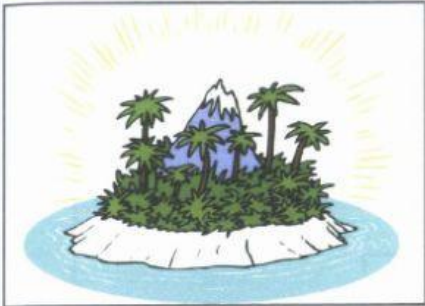
Then, one day, he saw a pirate ship. He was not (2) because he knew he was cleverer than any pirate.

After some years a big ship came to the island. The people from this ship were very (5) and helped Jack to go back to his country.

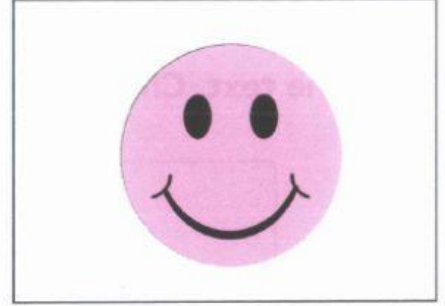

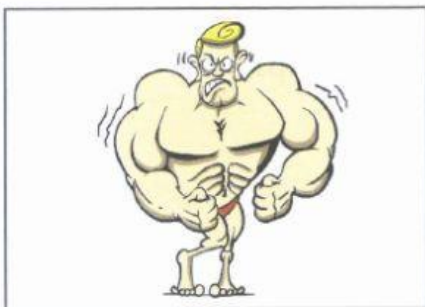

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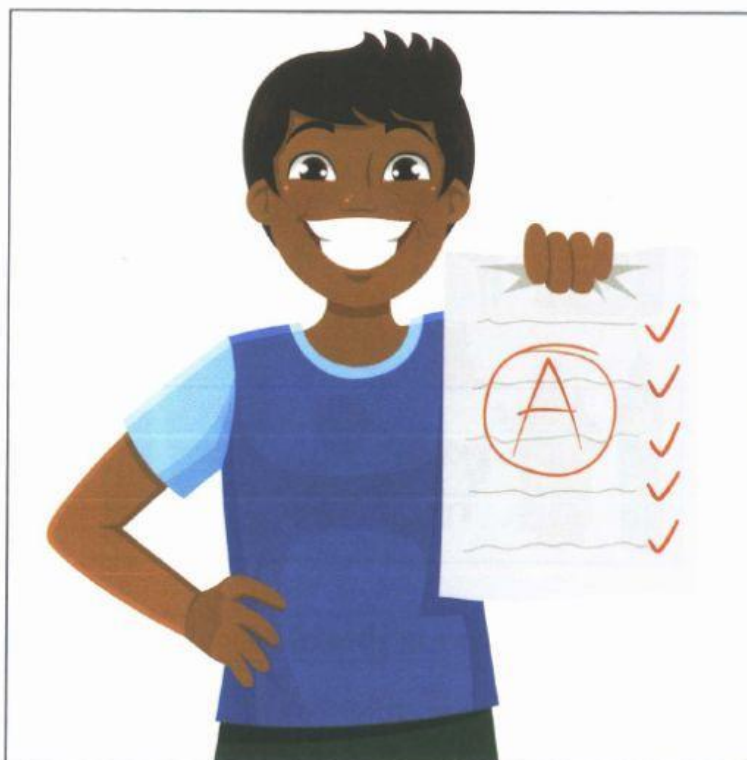
