Listening Strategy: Analyzing Pictures

In Part 1 of the TOEIC®, you will answer questions based on a photograph. Some photographs feature people, and some photographs do not. There are different strategies to use for each type.

1. Photographs without People

Some photographs do not have any people in them. Instead, they have objects. The descriptions might focus on the location or condition of the objects. Listen carefully for correct prepositions and adjectives.

- **Prepositions of place** such as *in, on, under, beside, next to, above, between, near, far*, etc. describe the relationship between two objects.
- **Adjectives** such as *neat, messy, dirty, clean, organized, disorganized, new, old, broken*, etc. describe the condition of something.

Note The spoken descriptions may use the correct preposition or adjective with an incorrect object. Listen for the answer choice that accurately uses the items and a correct preposition.



Ex (A) The printer is next to the laptop computer. ✗
(There is no printer in the photograph.)

(B) The hard drive is on the computer. ✗
(*On* is not the correct preposition.)

(C) The laptop computer is near the receptionist. ✗
(There are no people in the photograph.)

(D) The hard drive is beside the computer. ✓
(*Beside* is the correct preposition and both items are in the photograph.)

2. Photographs with People

The descriptions for photographs with people may focus on the actions and appearance of the people. Listen carefully for correct verbs and details.

- **Actions:** Listen for simple verbs (*sit, stand, look at, sleep, walk, ride, work, talk, speak*, etc.). Correct answers accurately describe what is happening in the photograph. Choices that require an inference are usually incorrect.
- **Appearance:** Focus on simple identifiers such as *man/woman, boy/girl, worker, long/short hair, tall/short, with a mustache*, etc. Correct answers rarely have test takers guess at the jobs of the people. Jobs that can clearly be shown in a photograph (*police officer, taxi driver, farmer, doctor*) are sometimes used.



Ex (A) The man is looking at the computer. (The man is not looking at the computer.)

(B) **The woman is fixing the computer.** (The woman is using tools on the computer. This is the best choice.)

(C) The man is buying a computer. (This is an inference. There is nothing to show he is buying the computer.)

(D) The woman is talking to the man. (Their mouths are closed. Neither one is talking.)
