For actions that happened in the past and we know exactly when



Form: We add **"ed"** to all regular verbs.

Irregular verbs must be learnt by heart.

## QUESTIONS



Did

Did+ subject+ verb (base form)+ complement?

Did you see my credit card yesterday?  
Did he study last night?

## POSITIVE



Subject+ verb in past+complement.

Yes, they went to the school last week.  
Yes, she studied last night.

## NEGATIVES

Did not  
Didn't

Did+ not +subject+ verb (base form)+complement.

No, I did not see your credit card last Wednesday.  
No, she didn't cook last weekend.

## SIMPLE PAST WITH CONNECTORS

With yesterday, then, ago last night/week/year/month, in 2021, in January (month).




