Do opposites attract?

Television and movies have taught us that "opposites attract." No one has been able to prove it, but many studies have suggested that this isn't a good way to choose a life partner. Most studies show that while people may think they want someone who is their opposite, they choose someone whose personality is very similar to their own.

There may be a biological explanation for the opposites attract theory. Many women are attracted to the scent of men who have major histocompatibility complex (MHC) genes that are different from their own. Studies show that women may be unconsciously seeking out these different genes to give their children the best possible chance at survival.

However, successful relationships are a result of many factors. People are often attracted to what they perceive themselves to be. People also tend to be attracted to people who have similar

interests, views, and attitudes. Though a mutual love of movies will not make a relationship perfect, at least you'll have something to talk about. Similar attitudes about religion and family are also often important.

People aren't just looking for their clone, though. They are looking for someone who complements them. Someone who is naturally anxious might choose a partner who is very calm and easygoing. Someone who is bad with managing money might seek out someone who is very organized and on top of things.
