## REMEMBER!

Affirmative	Negative	Question
I <b>play</b> the piano.	I <b>don't</b> <b>play</b> the piano.	<b>Do</b> I <b>play</b> the piano? Yes I <b>do</b> / No, I <b>don't</b>
He <b>plays</b> the piano.	He <b>doesn't</b> <b>play</b> the piano.	<b>Does</b> he <b>play</b> the piano? Yes, he <b>does</b> / No, he <b>doesn't</b>
She <b>goes</b> home.	She <b>doesn't</b> <b>go</b> home.	<b>Does</b> she <b>go</b> home? Yes, she <b>does</b> / No, she <b>doesn't</b>
They <b>go</b> home.	They <b>don't</b> <b>go</b> home.	<b>Do</b> they <b>go</b> home? Yes, they <b>do</b> / No, they <b>don't</b>
