In the UK, families often celebrate Christmas together, so they can watch each other open their presents. Most families have a Christmas tree in their house for Christmas. The decorating of the tree is usually a family occasion, and everybody helps.

Holly, ivy and mistletoe are also sometimes used to decorate homes or other buildings. Most villages, towns and cities are decorated with Christmas lights over Christmas. Often a famous person **switches them on**. The most famous Christmas lights in the UK are in Oxford Street in London. Every year thousands of people go to watch the **big 'switch on'** around the beginning of

November. In the UK, the most important Christmas meal is usually at lunchtime or early afternoon on Christmas Day. It is normally roasted Turkey and roasted vegetables. It is often served with cranberry sauce and bread sauce. Dessert is often **Christmas pudding**.



People often eat **mince pies** and chocolates as well! The dinner table is decorated with a Christmas cracker for each person and sometimes flowers and candles. The **Christmas cracker** is a cardboard tube covered in paper, with surprises inside. Two people take the cracker from each side and pull, the person who keeps the biggest part, wins the surprise inside. The prizes can be a little toy, a paper with a joke and a **paper crown**. People wear the paper crowns for dinner.

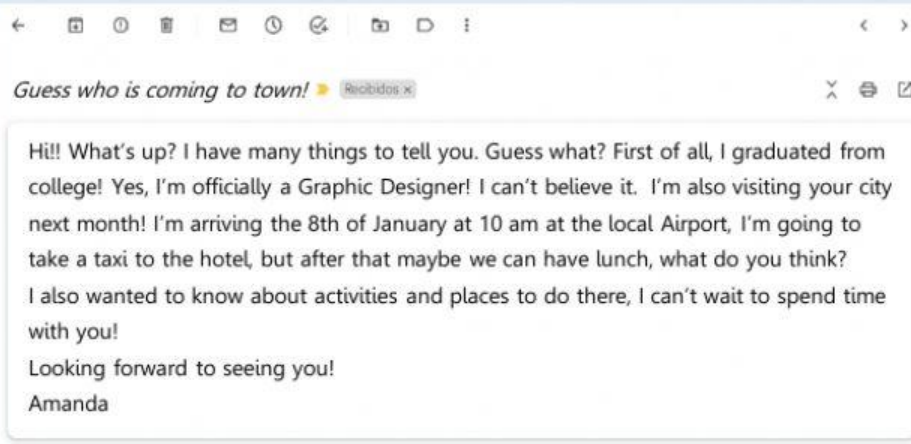
