

PART FIVE: SPEAKING

Part 1

In this section the interviewer will ask you general questions on everyday, familiar topics – *your home town, education, work, free time and leisure activities, plans for the future, etc.*

1. Where do you live and what do you like and dislike about living there?
2. Do you enjoy spending time at home?
3. What are your interests and hobbies?
4. How do you spend your free time?
5. Do you have any plans for your summer holidays? will you go on your own or with your family or friends?

Part 2 – interactive task

In this part of the interview, you should talk with your partner about a given topic.

The topics can be from the following areas: *education, work and employment, technology, international relations, communication, transport, health, the environment, science, business.*

Sample task:

Talk together about these problems that people may experience when they work abroad and give suggestions how they can overcome them. Then decide which two are the most difficult to deal with and why.

- language
- loneliness
- cultural differences
- finding accommodation
- making friends
- money

Part 3

The interviewer will ask questions related to the topic in Part 2.

Sample questions:

1. Would you like to study at a foreign university? (Why/why not?)
2. Would you like to work in a different country? (Why/why not?)
3. What do you think are the main problems people encounter when working in an international team?
4. Do you prefer to work as part of a team or individually? Why?
