

CHRISTMAS

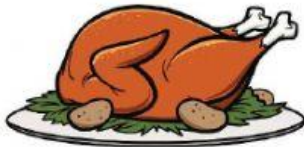
A. While- reading:

Every year in December Christians around the world celebrate Christmas to remember the birth of Jesus Christ. Besides Christmas Day on December 25th, Christmas celebrations also include Christmas Eve (December 24th) and Boxing Day (December 26th).

On Christmas Eve, some people spend the night **carol singing**, **attending a midnight church service**, or going out to the **pub** with their friends or family. For young children, Christmas Eve is the time when Father Christmas or Santa comes and brings them presents. Before going to bed, children **hang their stockings** on the fireplace, and in the next morning, they will check the stockings for presents.

The main celebration, Christmas Day, is the time for gift giving and **family gathering**. Families start opening presents at around 8 a.m. and then they sit down to have breakfast. Afterward, they can attend church or cook a big Christmas dinner, which is usually served at lunchtime with **roast turkey**, vegetables, and **mashed potatoes**. For dessert, there's a rich, fruity cake called **Christmas pudding**.

Boxing Day, which takes place on 26 December, was traditionally the day to open the Christmas box and share the contents with the poor. Today, Boxing Day is a bank holiday and is primarily known as a shopping holiday as many shops open very early and offer **sales**.
