Describe Characters

In this lesson, you will . . .

- find details that describe what a character looks like,
- identify characters traits by examining their thoughts and feelings,
- understand how characters change in a story.

Learn about Characters

- **Characters** are the people, animals, or made-up creatures in a story.
- Stories can have one character or many characters.
- You can identify characters by asking, *Who is this story about?*
- Authors use **details** to tell you about characters.
- Details can include descriptions of a character's face, body, clothing, and age.

Identify Character Descriptions

Learn about Character Traits

Stories can tell you about what characters are like on the inside, too.

Character traits describe personality and how the character *usually* behaves and why. Authors use details to show character traits.

Feelings

What is the character feeling?

A character who feels excited on a roller coaster might be **adventurous**.

Actions

What is the character doing?

A character reading a book might be **curious**.

Motivations

Why is the character doing something?

A character who wants to win an award might be **competitive**.

Thoughts

What is the character thinking?

A character who thinks *I hope nobody is watching* might be **shy**.

Words

What is the character saying?

A character who says "Go to the end of the line!" might be **bossy**.

Understand Character Changes

In many stories, characters learn lessons, develop new attitudes, and even change their behaviors. These character changes usually happen over time.

Beginning

You learn about a character's strengths and weaknesses.

Middle

An event occurs that causes a character to change the way they act, think, or feel.

End

A character shows growth through different actions or thoughts.
