3RD PERSON SINGULAR

- Most verbs take -s in the 3rd person singular
 - Live-lives
 - Talk-talks
- Verbs ending in -ss, -sh, -ch, -x and -o, take -es in the third person singular
 - Watch-watches
 - Miss-misses
 - Finish-finishes
- Verbs ending in consonant+y, drop the -y and take -ies
 - Cry-cries
- Verbs ending in vowel+y, take -s only.
 - Say-says

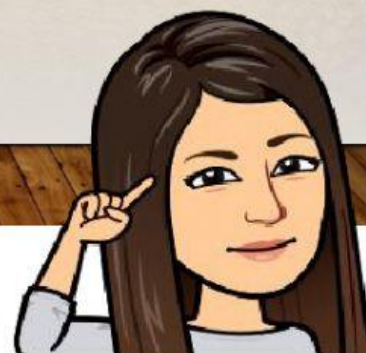

ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY

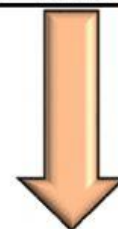


He **SOMETIMES** plays football
