3. (future plans) when details have been decided

E.g. "What are you doing tonight?"

"I'm having dinner with Michael"

Future Simple

4. On-the-spot decision

E.g. "I'm thirsty"

"I'll get you some water"

5., offers, requests, threats, warnings

E.g. I will always trust you!

6.and opinions based on what you believe, used especially with **I hope, I expect, I believe, probably, I'm sure, I'm afraid**

E.g. I hope it won't rain tomorrow!

7. Future..... Which we cannot control

E.g. Summer will be here soon.

Be Going To

8. Based on present evidence

E.g. We haven't got a map and it's getting dark. We are going to get lost.

E.g. He's going to take up tennis, he is determined.

Future Continuous (subject + will + be + vb. Ing)

10. at a stated future time

E.g. This time next year she will be running her own business!

11. Actions which are the result of a

E.g. I'll be playing tennis on Sunday. (= I always play tennis on Sunday, it's part of my routine)

12. When we ask politely about people's..... because we want to see if they can do something for us

E.g: Will you be going shopping soon? Can you get some milk too, please?

Future Perfect (subject + will + have + past participle)

13. To talk about.....actions before a future time, usually used with **by**

E.g. They will have moved to Spain by December.

Future Perfect Continuous (subject + will + have + been + vb. Ing)

14. To talk about the..... Of an action up to a time in the future

E.g. By June he will have been working on the project for 4 months.
