- Obligation, rules:
You must listen in class.
- Strong recommendation:
You must come and see me soon!

MUSTN'T is used for:

- Prohibition / against the law:
You mustn't shout in class.

HAVE TO / HAS TO is used for:

- Obligation:
I have to wear a uniform at school.

DON'T / DOESN'T HAVE TO is used for:

- No obligation / not necessary:
You don't have to bring your calculators tomorrow.
She doesn't have to pay. It's free.
