Here are some ideas of places to visit on your day out ...

## Covent Garden

There's a big market at Covent Garden, but there isn't a garden! You can buy all kinds of presents and souvenirs. There are also some nice shops and cafés here.

## Harrods

Harrods is a famous department store. It's got 330 different departments, including an enormous supermarket. You can have lunch here – there are 18 bars and restaurants. There's even a traditional English pub!

## Buckingham Palace

The Queen sometimes lives at Buckingham Palace, opposite St James's Park. There are 775 rooms in the Palace, but you can't visit all of them!

## Trafalgar Square

In the middle of Trafalgar Square, there's a statue of Admiral Nelson. It's called 'Nelson's Column' and it's 56 metres tall. The National Gallery is next to Trafalgar Square.
