If mum doesn't give us any money, we will not buy the tickets

if-clause

main clause

Unless mum gives us some money, we will not buy the tickets

if-clause

main clause

Unless = if ... not except that = a no ser que / a menos que

We won't go to the beach if the weather is cold tomorrow

Unless the weather is hot / isn't cold tomorrow, we won't go to the beach

TYPES

0 → GENERAL TRUTHS

'If you heat ice, it melts'

'If I go to bed late, I get tired'

what's always true

if-clause

main clause

present simple

present simple

1 → REAL SITUATIONS

'If you call me, I will go with you'

likely to happen

if-clause

main clause

present simple

will + infinitive

2 → HYPOTHETICAL/UNREAL SITUATIONS

'If I won the lottery, I would buy a new and bigger house'

NOT
likely to happen

if-clause

main clause

past simple

would + infinitive

3 → HYPOTHETICAL PAST SITUATIONS

'If I had won the lottery, I would have bought a new house'

impossible to
happen

if-clause

main clause

past perfect

would have + 3rd column

WISHES and REGRETS

- to express **WISHES** we use the past simple tense with 'I WISH'

'I wish you bought me a present for my birthday'

'I wish I were younger and taller'

- to express **REGRETS** we use the past perfect tense with 'I WISH'

'I wish you had bought me a present for my birthday'

'I wish I had been younger and taller'
