Southern African governments are in a terrible dilemma: they have to choose between letting their citizens starve to death or giving them genetically modified (GM) food that many believe is harmful to human health. This is the problem which resulted when the United Nations' World Food Program (WFP) provided Southern African governments with thousands of tons of emergency food came from US, which produces large quantities of genetically maize and other grain.

Several government in the region objected to the GM grains, especially Zambia and Zimbabwe, the countries hardest hit by the drought. In Zambia, where some GM grains had already arrived, the government has banned their distribution until the issue of safety is addressed.

Many Zambians believe that GM foods may lead to people experiencing new allergies and resistance to antibiotics. There are also fears that genetically modified seeds may destroy local crops as **they** are much stronger. Finally, and perhaps most importantly, GM crops may have lasting effects on the ecosystem as the change in the plant may cause it to be toxic. This is turn may lead to the extinction of some species and as a result, be catastrophic for the natural world.

Supporters of genetically modified foods, of course, claim that there is no solid evidence that GM foods have harmful side effects, adding that they can provide immediate relief to famine victims. But the true cost of using them won't be known until many decades have passed. Let's hope that by then, it's not too late.

Strauss vs Ellis

Who designed The Golden Gate Bridge ?

The Golden Gate Bridge is a suspension bridge that spans San Francisco Bay. The bridge's design has generally been attributed to Joseph Strauss, a German-American engineer and designer. However, recent evidence proves that Charles Ellis, a professor, engineer and mathematician, was chiefly responsible for the design of the bridge between 1929 and 1931.

An argument over the time it was taking to complete the design, along with the number of telegrams Ellis was using to discuss the design with other engineers, led Strauss to accuse Ellis of wasting time and money. Strauss then dismissed Ellis in late 1931 and systematically removed any mention of Ellis' name from his final report on the bridge issued in 1938.

Ellis was finally given official recognition for his part in the designing process of the Golden Gate Bridge on May 10, 2007.

Golden Gate Bridge

Due to its magnificent design, the Golden Gate Bridge was named one of the "Seven Engineering Wonders of the Modern World".

One of the most interesting Golden Gate Bridge facts is that only 11 workers died during its construction, a new safety record for the time. In the 1930s, bridge builders expected at least one fatality per \$1 million in construction costs, and builders expected around 35 people to die while erecting the Golden Gate Bridge. One of the bridge's safety innovations was a net placed under the work site. During construction, this net saved the lives of 19 men, who are often called the members of the "Half Way to Hell Club".

People come from all over the globe to learn how this bridge was built. They even come to be inspired by it. The best ways of exploring this attraction and appreciating its true beauty are either to book a Golden Gate Bridge bike tour, offered from spring through fall, or simply to walk over it.
