1. To **quench** a candle/ a fire/ the flames/ somebody's desire/ passion...
2. **Unattended** baggage/ gangway/ machinery room... / to leave children unattended
3. **Fireman's**/ skiing/ a bicycle repair **outfit**
4. A garden/ fire **hose**/ to direct one's **hose** at the burning building
5. The pipe burst and **jets** of water shot across the room
6. To drive there and back on a single **tank** of petrol
7. To **put out** a cigarette/ fire = to extinguish
8. To **spray** paint/ perfume/ throat **spray**
9. **Gross** weight/ somebody's **gross** income (i.e. before tax)
10. **Net** weight/ a salary of \$30 000 **net** (i.e. after tax has been paid)
11. **Maximum/ minimum** quantity of something
12. A filing **cabinet**/ a medicine cabinet/ china cabinet
13. To set off a burglar/ smoke **alarm**; to make the **alarm** start ringing; rumours of something turned out to be a false **alarm**; to hear one's **alarm**-clock go off in the morning; My car **alarm** went off in the middle of night/ the fire **alarm** went off; if you open the door, it will set off the **alarm**.
14. To **catch fire**: e.g., The car overturned and **caught fire**
15. To **set fire to something**: e.g., Pirates **set fire to** the ship.
16. The **ratio of** women **to** men in the factory is 3 to 1
17. A dog with **foam** at its mouth/ shaving **foam**/ bath **foam**/ the breaking waves left the beach covered with **foam**...
18. **At the rate** you work, you'll never finish!/ one's pulse **rate**/ a rising birth **rate**/ the population was growing **at** an alarming **rate**/ interest **rates** have fallen from 8% to 5%/ (currency) exchange **rate**/ the annual birth/divorce **rate**.
19. A sign flashed up telling them to **extinguish/ put out** their cigarettes.
20. To **smoulder**: e.g., He sensed a **smouldering** hostility against him
21. To **smother**: e.g., The girls tried to **smother** their giggles/ a laugh. She **smothered** the child with kisses. To use a wet towel to **smother** the fire.

Irregular verbs:

Set – set – set – **setting** (Somebody can **set fire to** something and it is a bad thing to do. An alarm can **set off**.)

Catch – caught – caught – **catching** (Some object may **catch** fire by accident)

Put – put – put – **putting** (A fire can be **put out** or extinguished)

Spread – spread – spread – **spreading** (A fire may **spread** easily.)

Go – went – gone – **going** (An alarm can **go off**. A fire can **go out** or **die down**.)

Break out – broke out – broken out – **breaking out** (a fire, fight or war can **break out**. The noun will be the **outbreak** of a disease, fire, war etc.)

Light – lit – lit – **lighting** (*to light* – to make something start to burn: e.g., He stopped **to light** the cigarette. I **lit** the fire and poured a drink. I couldn't get the candles **to light**.)
