### Developing features of pronunciation

Watch this Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix movie clip as many times as you need and then do the activities below.



Parts of the tone group :

(TS) **Tonic Syllable**: Is the main stress in the unit.

(OS) **Onset**: Is the first stressed syllable in the unit.

(PH) **Pre-head**: Is anything unstressed at the beginning of the unit.

(H) **Head**: is everything from the onset to the tonic syllable.

(T) **Tail**: Is everything after the tonic syllable.

Example: I **don't need to talk** to you about anything.

## Activity 1

### Tone group

Every tone group (TG) has one intonation pattern; the pattern begins at the TS and ends at the end of the unit. If the TG has not tail, the pattern will bend. If the TG has a tail, the pattern will include step. **Remember:** Tone groups are said in a single breath.
