The Budslau Fest takes place Budslau village, in the Minsk region. Pilgrims all over Belarus and other countries have participated in it the seventeenth century. Every year on the first weekend of July thousands pilgrims come Budslau to join the celebrations in honour of the Budslau Icon of Our Lady. The Icon, the patroness of Belarusian people, is known many miracles and Budslau is recognized as the place where, according to legend, Our Lady appeared to believers July 1588. The celebration includes priests (священники /святыари) welcoming the pilgrims, masses, a night procession the Icon and candles and hours of prayer (молитва / мальва) to the Mother of God. The tradition is handed from generation generation and attracts families and believers all ages. The local inhabitants are very proud the relic; they show pilgrims a warm welcome and invite them local homes to share meals them.
