1. You can't watch this film, you aren't old
2. I'm not strong to move this huge box.
3. I'm only 17, I'm young to drive a car.
4. These trousers aren't big for me.
5. This t-shirt isn't expensive, I will buy it.

2 Complete using IS / ISN'T AS+ adjective + AS

1. (car 4,000 euros – motorbike 8,000 euros) **expensive**

The car the motorbike

2. (elephant – cat) **big**

The cat the elephant.

3. (skyscraper – house) **high**

The house the skyscraper.

4. (cat – lion) **dangerous**

The cat the lion.

5. (lettuce – cake) **healthy**

The cake the lettuce.

3 Complete with the FIRST CONDITIONAL

Example: If she **doesn't do** her homework, she **will get** bad marks

1. If you (study), you (pass) the exam.
2. They (get) wet if they (take) the homework.
3. She (not save) money if she (buy) a lot of things.

4. I (be) worried if he (not come) soon.

5. If you (not take) the bus, you (be) late.

4 Complete with the SECOND CONDITIONAL

Example: If she didn't have money, she would ask her mum

1. If I (see) a ghost, I (be) scared.

2. If I (get) lost, I (buy) a map.

3. If he (live) on a tropical island, he (swim) every day.

4. If I (go) to London, I (visit) the Big Ben.

5. If they (lose) the match, they (not go) to the final.
