A	His temper affected the weather and he could change his shape. He ruled over all other gods and goddesses and was married to Hera. He was worshipped through altars, shrines and daily offerings by Greek people.
B	He learned to cultivate grapes and became the first person to make wine. Then he taught people how to make it. He was celebrated on special days in which people danced and sang in a mythological tragedy.
C	He was Zeus' brother and one of the most powerful gods. Sailors prayed to him before their trips to be safe because his temper controlled the seas.
D	She is the patron goddess of Athens as her main temple was the Parthenon. She didn't have a mother because she was directly born from Zeus' head.
E	This god was Zeus' youngest brother. He could fly thanks to his winged shoes, he was very fast and all gods and goddesses trusted him. He was also associated with fertility, music, luck and deception.
F	He was less worshipped than other gods because he was cruel. His parents, Zeus and Hera, didn't like him either although he was handsome.
G	He was Aphrodite's husband. Unlike most gods, he wasn't perfect. Instead, he had some physical defects. He was associated with craftsmen and blacksmiths.
H	People believed that this goddess had risen from the sea upon a shell. She was largely worshipped in many Greek city-states.
I	She was Apollo's twin sister and she was a good hunter. She was the favourite goddess amongst the rural population and she punished people who hurt animals that were sacred to her.
J	She controlled the seasons and the growth of crops. That's why Greek people prayed to her hoping that their crops would grow successfully. She taught people how to grow corn.
K	She was Zeus' wife and the queen of Greek gods and goddesses. She protected families and was known to be severe and reserved. However, she was vengeful too.
L	He played music for the Greek gods and goddesses and also taught humans the art of medicine. That's why he is sometimes called "The Healer". He treated people's diseases, but he also spread infection to those who angered him.
