3. The Generic Structures of Narrative Text:



There are **4 (four)** generic structures of narrative text:

The generic structures of narrative text

1) ORIENTATION:

Sets the scene: **where** and **when** the story happened and **introduces the participants** of the story: who and what is involved in the story.



2) COMPILED:

Where the **problems** in the story developed

3) RESOLUTION:

Where **the problem is solved**. Either in a **happy ending** or a **bad ending**.

4) RE-ORIENTATION or CODA (optional):

The lesson from the story (**moral value**). It is a kind of **an advice** or **teaching** from the writer.

4. The Kinds or Types of Narrative Text:

There are so many kinds or types of narrative text. Here the writer concludes some of the most popular ones:

4.1. Folklore or Folktale (examples: *Malin Kundang*, *Joko Tarub*, *Bawang Merah Bawang Putih*, etc.)

↳ Folklore spreads **by word of mouth**, so that it will be told from generation to generation until it becomes part of the community's tradition

4.2. **The Legend** (examples: **The Legend of Surabaya**, Robin Hood, etc.)

- Legend is a folk tale that many people consider real because it contains **heroic content**.

4.3. **Fable** (examples: **The Lion and The Mouse**, *Kancil Nyolong Timun*, etc.)

- Fable is a story that teaches a lesson, often using **animal characters** that behave like people


4.4. **Fairy Tales** (examples: **Cinderella**, Snow White, Peter Pan, etc.)

- Fairy Tale is a simple story about **magical creatures**, such as fairies, dragons, witches and princesses, giants and others


