

Forming the Subjunctive Mood

In the present **subjunctive mood** is used to express a wish, suggestion or command that is contrary to the fact. The base form of the verb is used regardless of the subject. This holds true even with the verb *to be*. It only occurs in noun clauses beginning with the word 'that'. To make a subjunctive clause negative, add 'not' before the subjunctive verb.
