Question form

Affirmative	Negative
I'll probably / definitely study English.	I probably / definitely won't stay in New York.

Take note!

- I think and I don't think always take an affirmative verb.
I think I'll study in the U.S.
I don't think I'll study in the U.S.

WILL I/you/she/he/it/we/they **TRAVEL AROUND THE WORLD?**
Yes, I/you/she/he/it/we/they **WILL**.
No, I/you/she/he/it/we/they **WON'T**. (WILL NOT)

WHAT WILL you/she/he/it/we/they **DO?**

I/ you/she/he/it/we/they **will**
