INTERROGATIVE	SHORT ANSWERS		
Have I got...?	Yes, I have. / No, I haven't.		
Have you got...?	Yes, you have. / No, you haven't.		
Has he got...?	Yes, he has. / No, he hasn't.		
Has she got...?	Yes, she has. / No, she hasn't.		
Has it got...?	Yes, it has. / No, it hasn't.		
Have we got...?	Yes, we have. / No, we haven't.		
Have you got...?	Yes, you have. / No, you haven't.		
Have they got...?	Yes, they have. / No, they haven't.		

We use *have got* to talk about possession, family relationships and illnesses.

Martin has got a sailing boat.

They haven't got a cat.

Alice has got two brothers.

I've got a toothache.

Note!

The short forms of the 3rd person singular *have* and *be* are identical.

Tim's tired. = *Tim is tired.*

Tim's got a dog. = *Tim has got a dog.*

Note!

In short answers we do not repeat *got*.

Has Toby got blond hair?

Yes, he has.
