Getting work experience

For many young people, finding a job without having any experience is a great challenge. Here are three ways young people in the UK can solve this problem.

An apprenticeship

In the UK, an apprenticeship is a paid, full-time position between one and five years in length that allows someone to be trained in skills relating to a particular area of work. Apprenticeships can be done in many different industries, but apprentices have to be at least 16 years old and no longer in full-time education. You will need to apply for a specific position, and if your application is successful, you become an employee. Apprentices spend at least 20% of their time training for the role, and although the pay is low, they may get a job when they finish, if they work hard.

A part-time job

In most cases, a part-time job is better paid per hour than an apprenticeship, but it may be for only a few hours a week. Although young people probably won't work in the area that they are thinking about specialising in, they will learn some valuable soft skills. Soft skills, such as critical thinking and time management, are personal qualities and abilities that you need to succeed in many jobs, and employers often ask for them. Working as a waiter in a restaurant, for instance, will develop many such abilities including verbal communication, problem solving and maths.

Unpaid work

To some, this may look like the worst option of the three, but there are many benefits. For example, if a young person wants to work in social media, they could try offering their services to a local company. They will help their local community, get valuable experience, their CV will look better, they will make contacts in the industry and if they impress the boss, they may be offered a full-time position on finishing their studies.
