


The thousands of birthday cards sent to him might have brightened his bleak walls, but prison officials never allowed Mandela to read them. The majority of the people in South Africa are black, yet for many generations they had no say in how their government was ruled. Since Mandela was a young man, he has spoken out for freedom and fairness for all South Africans. The people in the white-ruled government were scared of Mandela's ideas of justice and in 1964 sentenced him to life in jail.
