## will: prediction

We use *will* to talk about a future event, something that we think or predict will happen. We usually use the contraction *won't* (*will not*) for a negative prediction. After *will* / *won't* we use the infinitive without *to*.

AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	INTERROGATIVE	ANSWER
I will	I won't	Will I .... ?	Yes, you will No, you won't
You will	You won't	Will you .... ?	Yes, I will No, I won't
He will	He won't	Will he .... ?	Yes, He will No, He won't
She will	She won't	Will she .... ?	Yes, She will No, she won't
It will	It won't	Will it ... ?	Yes, It will No, it won't
We will	We won't	Will we ... ?	Yes, we will / you will No, we won't/ you won't
They will	They won't	Will they ...?	Yes, they will No, they won't
