7.This is a diner. Mabel and Dipper like to eat out here.



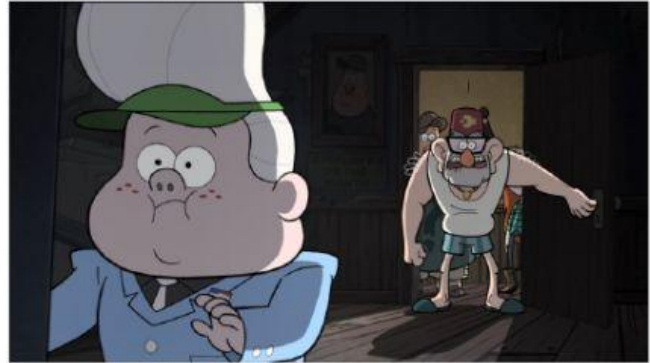
10.This is an island. Dipper and Mabel want to find a monster there.
