WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?

My English teacher is boring.

My English teacher is bored.

CAUSE OR SOURCE OF THE FEELING

Adjectives ending -ING
are used to describe things or people.

RECEIVER OF THE FEELING

Adjectives ending -ED
are used to describe feelings.

THE ENGLISH STUDENT . PARTICIPIAL ADJECTIVES



- ❖ In the picture above you can tell these friends are not having a great lunch together. The woman on the left is feeling bored. The woman on the right thinks her friend is a boring person (not interesting to be with). Can you distinguish the difference now?

The words "bored" and "boring" are known as participial adjectives.

- ❖ Present Participle (-ing) is used to describe something or someone.
 - ✓ "I watched an interesting TV program about American history last night."
 - ✓ "This film is boring. Let's stop watching it."
- ❖ Past Participle (-ed) is used to describe how people feel about something or someone.
 - ✓ "I'm interested in American history."
 - ✓ "I'm bored of my job. I want to find another one."

Describe the **characteristic** of a person, a thing or a situation. It **CAUSES** a feeling.

The books are boring. We are describing a characteristic of these books. What do these books cause? They make people feel bored.

ADJECTIVES
THAT END IN

-ED

Describe **a feeling** or an emotion. It is how we **FEEL** about something.

He is bored. This is his feeling right now. This feeling was caused by the books. He is not going to be bored for eternity. He feels bored for now. (It is temporary)

Example Sentences (compare the difference)

*I am **tired** right now. My flight was **tiring** (because it was a twelve-hour flight).*

*Public toilets are sometimes **disgusting**. I am **disgusted** by the smell of them.*

*Your speech was **inspiring**. I'm now **inspired** to do great things with my life.*
