

Sentence construction in the Present Simple Tense

Verb Tense ADJECTIVE affirmative sentence



Rules of forming the 3rd person singular:

The verbs in the 3rd person singular get **-s** ending. There are some spelling rules you have to learn.

- 1) **Y** changes into **-i** in the end of the verbs if there is a consonant before it.
e.g.: **try** \Rightarrow **tries**
- 2) If the verb ends with **-ss**, **-sh**, **-ch**, **-o** or **-x**, it gets **-es** ending in 3rd person singular.
e.g.: **wishes**, **mixes**, **matches**, **watches**, **misses**, **goes**, **does**
