

..... Reported Speech: Commands and Requests

- To report a command or a request, we use the following structure:

- tell for commands
- ask for requests



told/asked + person + to + verb

- If the person is a pronoun, we use an object pronoun (me, him, her, it, us, you, them).

E.g. “Go to the local college”.

The clerk told John to go to the local college.

“Could you fill in an application form, please?”

She asked him to fill in an application form.

- To report negative commands or requests, we use the following structure:

Told/ asked + person + not to + verb

E.g. “Don’t fill in the second part of the form.”

She told John not to fill in the second part of the form.
