

Grade 6: Fairy Tales and the past tense

Rules for Spelling the Simple Past Tense
for Regular Verbs

- 1) Add -ed to the simple form of the verb
Example: She talks.  She **talked**.
- 2) If the verb ends in -e, add ONLY -d.
Example: I dance.  I **danced**.
- 3) If the verb ends in -y, change the -y to -i and add -ed.
Example: Babies cry.  **Babies cried**.
- 4) If a verb is one syllable and ends in consonant-vowel-consonant (but not -w or -x), double the consonant and add-ed.
Example: We stop.  **We stopped**.
(Note: this rule is complicated. Don't stress about it. Just try.)



Little Red Riding Hood

ATTENTION!!! There is NO CONJUGATION in the Simple Past Tense!!!

Example: I walked. You walked. He walked. She walked. It walked. We walked. They walked.


