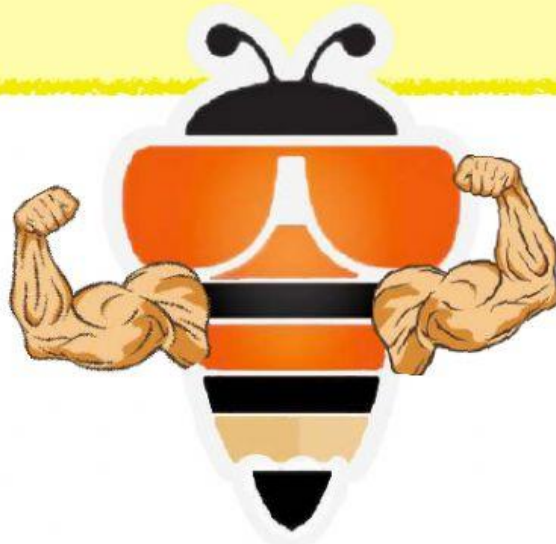
Meaning: an action should be done now rather than later.
