**Grammar + Plus****Prepositions with future time expressions**

- Notice how prepositions are used in future time expressions:

*My friends are having a party **on** Saturday.*

*We're moving house **in** two weeks' (time). (=two weeks from now)*

*I'm seeing my cousins **at** the weekend.*

- Phrases with *next* and *this* do not have a preposition:  
*We're going **on** holiday **ø** next week/this weekend/tomorrow.*
