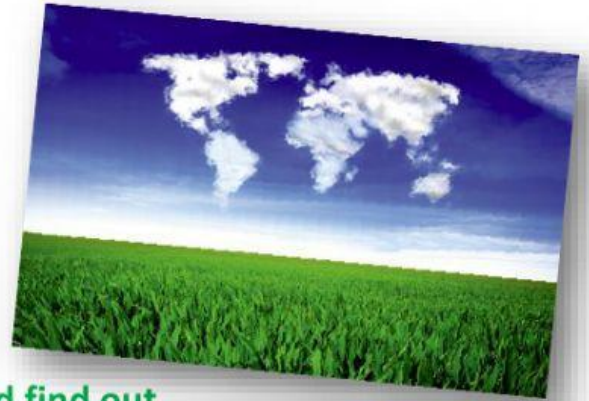


# World Environment Day



## 1. What's a carbon footprint? Read and find out.

World Environment Day takes place on 5th June. Each year, it's celebrated in a different country and it's got a different theme. The aim is to raise awareness of ways to protect the environment. Our carbon footprint is one of the issues people want to raise awareness of.

We use energy every day and a lot of it is made from burning coal. When we burn coal, we produce a gas which is made of tiny pieces of carbon, just like the material in your pencil. This gas is called CO<sub>2</sub>. It's bad for the environment because it traps the heat from the Sun, which makes the Earth hotter. The good news is that the world's plants and trees can absorb CO<sub>2</sub> and produce clean oxygen for us to breathe. However, we mustn't produce more carbon than the trees can absorb. The amount of carbon we produce is called our carbon footprint. If we use less energy, our footprint is smaller and if we use more energy, our footprint is bigger. Do you know that a flight from London to Tokyo produces 1,056kg of carbon per passenger?
