My name's Morgan and I live in Llangollen, a small town in the North of Wales. Our town is famous because we have an international music festival here every year. In our language, Welsh, it's called the Eisteddfod. It started in 1946, just after the end of the Second World War. A man called Harold Tudor heard his milkman singing one morning and it gave him an idea. He decided to start a music festival where people from all over the world could sing, dance and make music together in peace. The first Eisteddfod took place in 1947 with people from more than 14 countries taking part.

After that it got bigger and bigger, and now people come from the four corners of the world. Now there are around 5,000 singers and dancers, and 50,000 visitors. There are shows and competitions, but the most important thing is that everybody shares their culture and learns about other people. The festival is so important that in 2004 it was nominated for the Nobel Peace Prize. We didn't win, but we may get the prize another year.

I always go to the festival. Last year I went to a street dance workshop. It was good fun but very tiring – you need very strong legs! There were lots of people there and not everybody spoke English, but it didn't matter. We laughed a lot, and I made a friend from Japan and another from Greece. After the workshop we all left a message on the Tree of Peace. I wrote 'Let's be friends.' Then we went to watch the Parade of Nations. It's really colourful, everybody wears their national costumes and there is a huge parade through the town, with singing and dancing. In the evening we went to the Children's Storytelling competition. My favourite was an Irish story about some children who were turned into swans. It was a bit sad, but I liked it.
