'A woman from my bank phoned me, and told me that there was a problem with my account. She told me not to worry – she said that it was just a small technical problem. She explained that the bank had created a new account for me, and said that the safest thing to do was to move my money to the new account. She gave me the account number, and said that she would phone again in ten minutes to confirm that everything was OK.

'Then I realized – the person who had called me earlier was a fraudster, not a bank worker! I asked where my money had gone, and the bank told me that I had moved it to an account in a foreign country. They said that they couldn't do anything about it, and suggested that I call the police.'

Fortunately this story has a happy ending. The fraudsters weren't caught, but eventually Tony's friends got together and raised £1,000 for him. 'I'll be more careful in the future,' Tony told us. 'I've learned not to trust people all the time!'
