We use **will**:

- To talk about things we think are going to happen, based on (1) _____.
Ex: Perhaps we **will use** e-books for all our studies in the future
- To make (2) _____.
Ex: I'll **help** you with your homework.
- For unplanned decisions that we make (3) _____.
Ex: I feel tired. I think I'll **go** home now.

We use **going to**:

- To talk about (4) _____ for the future that haven't been arranged or agreed yet.
Ex: I'm **going to** visit my friend in Turkey sometime next year.
- To talk about things we expect to happen because of (5) _____.
Ex: It's **going to** rain soon. (There are big grey clouds)

We use the **present continuous**:

- For (6) _____. These are activities that we've agreed to do with other people. We know the details such as when, where, etc.
Ex: I'm **playing** in a football match on Saturday.

We use the **present simple**:

- For (7) _____.
Ex: The film **finishes** at 9:30 p.m.
