We use the future with going to:

- ✓ to express intention that a person is going to do in the near future.
- ✓ to express that something is going to happen with great certainty.

AFFIRMATIVE FORM

Subject	+ to be conjugated	+ going to	+ Verb infinitive	Complements
She	is	going to	dance	in the disco

She is going to dance in the disco

We can use words like:

Next week / month / year

Tomorrow

In one week / year / month
