

EMMA WATSON

Even as a child, Emma Watson wanted to be an actor. From the age of six, she was learning how to dance and sing after school, and was in many school plays. Her first paid acting job was as Hermione in the *Harry Potter* films. She didn't know then how big this project would be!

She often missed school because of *Harry Potter* but she and her co-stars had lessons each day at the places they were filming. She got excellent marks in her exams, which meant she could go to university anywhere. She chose the USA because she could study various subjects together, instead of just one in Britain.

Her student years have been fun and being famous hasn't given her many problems. She's had to speak

to journalists since she was nine, so answering students' questions is OK – but she doesn't want her friends to see her as different, which most of them have understood.

Emma earned more than ten million pounds from her *Harry Potter* work and will never need to work for money again. However, she still enjoys acting, as well as working in fashion, which she feels she understands because of her art studies at school.

Daniel Radcliffe (Harry) is special to Emma. During the filming of *Harry Potter* he always understood his job as an actor, but what mattered to her was that he kept everyone else interested in the whole project. Daniel says they are 'very much like brother and sister'.
