Present Perfect

We use **Present Perfect** + **ever/never** to talk about experiences up to now.

Have you ever been mountain biking?

No, **I've never been** mountain biking.

You can use **before** at the end of your question or answer.

Have you ever been bungee jumping **before**?

Yes, **I've been** bungee jumping **before**.
