

Read this information **carefully**



Adverbs of manner give us more information about verbs, and describe **HOW** things happen.

Read this example:

- My sister danced at the theatre yesterday.
- **How** did she dance?
- She danced **beautifully**.



This is an adverb of manner.

The **main verb** in this sentence is "dance", and by asking "How..?" we get more information about it ("beautifully" = adverb of manner).

How do we form adverbs of manner?

They are usually formed by **adding -ly** at the end of the **adjectives**.

slow → slowly

beautiful → beautifully

Sometimes there are **changes in spelling** when the adjective **ends in -y** or when the adjective **ends in -e**:

happy → happily

horrible → horribly

easy → easily

terrible → terribly

And there are some **irregular adverbs**:

good → well

fast → fast

Tick only the ADJECTIVES (example: fast, strong, ...)
