## Adjectives & Adverbs

- An **adjective** describes a **subject** when it comes after a linking verb. It can also come before a **noun** and describe it.
- An **adverb** usually comes after a **verb** and describes it. It can also come before an **adjective** or **adverb** and describes them.

Adjective & Adverb	Rule
Anne is a <b>beautiful</b> girl. She dances <b>beautifully</b> .	• Most adjectives + -ly kind - kindly   careful - carefully   honest - honestly
The question is <b>easy</b> . Ted answered the question <b>easily</b> .	• Adjectives ending in -y: y → ily lucky - luckily   angry - angrily   happy - happily
Brian is a <b>fast</b> runner. He runs <b>fast</b> .	• Adjectives = Adverbs early - early   hard - hard   late - late
I am a <b>good</b> baseball player. I play baseball <b>well</b> .	• Irregular adverb good - well
