


Prepositions of time

My birthday is on the 21st of August, in the summer.

___ Next year, it's at the weekend.

Usually when we talk about types of time, the words follow this rule:



But there are exceptions.

Parts of the day, any time starting from now = IN

Periods of time, night = AT

Today, tomorrow, yesterday, last..., next... = no preposition
