## Lesson 5 Present perfect affirmative and negative

| Affirmative            |               |                        |
|------------------------|---------------|------------------------|
| I / You /<br>We / They | 've<br>(have) | watered<br>the plants. |
| He / She               | 's<br>(has)   |                        |

| Negative             |                       |                        |
|----------------------|-----------------------|------------------------|
| I / You<br>We / They | haven't<br>(have not) | watered<br>the plants. |
| He / She             | hasn't<br>(has not)   |                        |

She hasn't swept the patio.
- You / cut the grass ✓
- We / wash the car ✓
- He / hang out the clothes ✗
- They / eat dinner yet ✗

### Look!

Remember, we make the past participle of regular verbs by adding *ed* (or *d*) to the end.

wash → washed

breathe → breathed

The past participles of irregular verbs with don't follow a pattern.

hang → hung do → done
