




# Irregular adjectives

The normal (regular) way to make comparative and superlative adjectives is to add *-er/-est* or use *more/most*, like this:

- *big* → *bigger* → *biggest*
- *expensive* → *more expensive* → *most expensive*

But there are also some **IRREGULAR ADJECTIVES**. Irregular adjectives change their form. Some of them are: "good" and "bad"

- *good* → *better than* → *the best*
- *bad* → *worse than* → *the worst*
