#### OF WHOM

Of Whom ise ikinci kelime olan kişinin birinic kelimeye ait olduğunu anlatır. Whose yerine kullanılır. Cümlede kullanım yerleri farklıdır.

#### Example

Ayla's brother had an accident. Ayla went to the hospital.

Ayla whose brother had an accident went to the hospital.

Ayla the brother of whom had an accident went to the hospital.

Ayla's car was sold. She went to Ankara.

Ayla whose car was sold went to Ankara.

Ayla the car of which was sold went to Ankara.
