The present continuous affirmative



Affirmative

I am playing
you are playing
he is playing
she is playing
it is playing
we are playing
you are playing
they are playing

Short forms

I'm playing
you're playing
he's playing
she's playing
it's playing
we're playing
you're playing
they're playing

We don't use short forms after two names.

Eric and Charlie **are playing** volleyball.

BUT

They're playing volleyball

John's playing volleyball.

We use the present continuous to talk about:

- Something that is happening at the moment we are speaking.

She's talking to someone on the phone at the moment.

The present continuous negative



Negative

I am not playing
you are not playing
he is not playing
she is not playing
it is not playing
we are not playing
you are not playing
they are not playing

Short forms

I'm not playing
you aren't playing
he isn't playing
she isn't playing
it isn't playing
we aren't playing
you aren't playing
they aren't playing
