SB = somebody

SW = somewhere

PHRASAL VERB	MEANING
Break down	1) stop working (vehicles, mechanical and electronic devices) 2) To lose control of one's feelings (be in tears, get angry)
Break into sth/sw	To enter a place by force. It's necessary to mention the place.
Break in	Used as a noun. Same meaning as “break into”
Break up	To end a relationship of any kind (romantic, business...)
Bring forward	To introduce or present an argument, a proposal or evidence for consideration
Bring in	1) To introduce a law or a rule 2) To take sb to a police station for questioning
Bring up	1) To raise a child into adulthood 2) To mention a subject for the first time in a conversation
